



Who is conducting this research study, where is it being conducted, and what are the benefits?

Dr. Anna Hohler is conducting this study at St. Elizabeth's Medical Center. The study is funded by the Parkinson's Foundation. The research is a multi-center nationwide study with aims to share Parkinson's disease genetic testing data from up to 500,000 study participants for research use. Your participation may provide more information about the possible roles of your genes in PD, benefit others in the future, or may help you determine if you are eligible for a clinical trial.

Study Participation

If you choose to participate, you will undergo a cheek swab collection. The sample obtained will be used for genetic testing and sent to Fulgent Genetics. You will receive a positive or negative result letter to inform you of your genetic test results. A genetic counseling appointment will be set up by either the study staff or Indiana University, a third-party entity collaborating with the Parkinson's Foundation for this study to offer genetic counseling, once the results are available. During this appointment, you will receive genetic education about your test results from Dr. Anna Hohler, or remotely from a certified genetic counselor from Indiana University. Your DNA and data will be banked for 10 years.
